
# CREATING HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES--ONE WILDLIFE HABITAT AT A TIME

Last summer, Northwest Seattle community members discussed opportunities and solutions to offset the alarming amount of green space, nature and wildlife habitat disappearing from NW Seattle. The outcome was registering NW SEATTLE AS A COMMUNITY WILDLIFE HABITAT with the National Wildlife Federation (NWF). As a registered wildlife habitat community we have many opportunities to support neighbors by certifying individual backyards, school grounds and public areas like parks, community gardens, places of worship and businesses through the NWF Certification program. Each certified site within the community will provide the four basic elements that all wildlife need: food, water, cover and places to raise young.

NWF Wildlife Habitat Communities also provide outreach to educate residents about sustainable gardening practices, such as reducing or eliminating chemical fertilizers and pesticides, conserving water,


planting native plants and trees, composting more. Groundswell NW's habitat team will host workshops & presentations about gardening for wildlife (2016 GNW Annual Meeting) and hold community events such as stream cleanups and invasive species removal to make the community healthier for people and wildlife alike.

### **NEW 17TH & DOCK STREET PROJECT**

In 2015, Groundswell NW was approached by the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) about a new open space being created as part of the greenway construction on 17th Ave NW. Knowing the challenges in acquiring new open space in the rapidly growing and increasingly expensive NW Seattle neighborhoods, we were pleased to hear of a new open space that would not have an acquisition cost. 17TH & DOCK future open space

The new greenway pro-

vides a safer and more desirable route for people who walk or ride bicycles in our neighborhood. As the greenway heads south toward Ballard Avenue, the route turns to the southwest at 17th Ave NW and NW Dock Pl. Thus, SDOT'S RECONFIGURATION OF THE INTERSECTION CREATED NEW OPEN SPACE!

Groundswell NW started an outreach campaign to engage nearby businesses and residents about how the open space should be used. We were also awarded an \$86,000 grant from Seattle's Department of Neighborhood's Neighborhood Park and Street Fund (NPSF) to help pay for improvements in the new open space, and approached by SDOT's Pavement to Parks Program to help engage neighbors with interim improvements.

Groundswell NW held a Speed Scrabble event in the

The meeting highlighted the BALLARD OPEN SPACE PLAN and facilitated an interactive exercise with the goal of getting a prioritized list of open space ideas that Groundswell NW could work on with community members to realize in the following years. One idea that came out near the top of the list was the need for more habitat. This is where our commitment to partner with the National Wildlife Federation to certify NW Seattle as Community Wildlife Habitat first got traction.

Each year at our annual meeting, we recognize "Local Heroes" in our community who have greatly contributed to Groundswell NW's mission: SHANNON DUNN was recognized for her commitment to building community and a sense of place through her involvement with many NW Seattle groups, including the EBCA, Groundswell NW, PlantAmnesty, Ballard District Council and Urban Design Framework; BILL FARMER was recognized for years of Parks advocacy work serving on the 2008 Parks and Green Space Levy Citizens committee and later on the Seattle Parks and Recreation Legacy Plan Advisory Committee, leading to the 2015 voter approved Seattle Park District; ANNE SAUER, a former Groundswell NW board member, was recognized for her volunteer work with the Sunset Hill Shilshole Gateway, spending dozens, if not hundreds, of hours weeding and cleaning up green spaces.

At the meeting, we also elected our officers for 2015: President Dawn Hemminger, Secretary Jan Satterthwaite and Treasurer Frana Milan.


